Whereof the date of November One thousand five hundred twenty nine And in the fift yeare
of the reigne of our Sovereign Lord King Charles the first John Winge late of
the Hague in Holland Clarke now livinge in the parish of St Mary Aldermary London
and beinge like in bodie but of good and perfect minde and memory, praised bee Allmightie
god, Doe make and ordaine this my last will and testament in manner and forme followinge
First and principallie I comitt my soule into the hand of Allmightie god my maker
trustinge and assuredly believing to have full and free remission of all my sinnes by and
through the only meritt and righteousnes of Jesus Christ my alone Saviour And my
bodie I comitt to the earth, of wherunt it came to bee decently buried where it shall please
the lord to direct And as touchinge my worldly estate and substance wherof I am now
possessed, I give and bequeath the same as followeth First wherof I am seised and
interested of and in retoynt land beinge freehold with thoppurtenance lyinge and beinge
in the parish of Eastston and Stroud in the County of Kent or elsewhere I will and
desire, and my minde and meaninge is that the same bee sold as soon as conveniently maye
bee by my Excutour hereafter named to the best profit and advantage, and the monye
thereof arisinge shalbe (with) all and singular my other goods Chattells and estate whatsoever
debited into two equall ytes and portions The one moiety wherof to bee had received and
enjoyed unto and by my lovinge wife Deborah and the other pte or moiety thereof to bee
equally and indifferently had, parted, debited and enjoyed unto and amongst all my Children
that and that like, except unto and by my daughter Deborah, whom I have already advanced
in marriage And therefore I will that what I have already given as her marriage portion
shalbe accounted as pte of her dividend and proportion of my said estate given amongst my
Children by this my will And my will and meaninge is and I doe hereby appoint That of
said legacies and portions shalbe paid unto my Sonne at thent severall ages of out and
twentie yeares and unto my daughters unmarried at thent like severall ages of out and
twentie yeares or severall daies of marriage with of them shall first happen And if any of
my Child or Children happen to die or depart this life before the said legacies shall growe
due to bee paid unto them or any of them, in and by this my will Then I will that the survivor
or survivors of him, her, or them that shall soe happen to die in the meane tyme shall have and
receive and enjoy the legacy and bequest of him, her, or them soe dyinge as is aforesaid equally
to and amongst all the said Survivor or Survivors And I hereby will that my said wife
shall have and enjoy the benefitt and profit of my Childrens portions hereafter by me
bequeathed towards their education and maintenance untill thent said portions shall growe
due and payable to them severally and respectively according to this my present will Item
I will that all such debts as I owe in right or in conscience, together with my funeral
charges shalbe first paid, deducted, and allowed out of all my estate And I doe hereby make
nominate and appoint my lovinge wife Deborah my Excutour of this my last will & testament
And my lovinge friends Edward Hoord of London Merchant, and Andrew Blake of
Stroud in the County of Kent Exorsors of the same In witness whereof I
have hereunto sett my hand and seale, Dated the daie and yeare first above writtten I doe
affirme that this will above writtten was pronounced accordinge to the Testatores minde
witnessed my hand by me Edward Hoord, I doe affirme the like witness my hand
Andrew Blake.

June of August One thousand five hundred and thirtie I Richard Lync of Shilhamp-
 ton in the parish of Southwinton in willed beinge weak in body but perfect in memory
 praised be God for it. Doe now make my last will and Testament in maner followinge first
 I bequeath my soule into the custody and keepinge of my Saviour Iesus Christ And my body
 to be buried in the Church or churchyard of Southwinton I give unto the parish Church
 thre shillinge fower pence And I give unto the poore of our parish thre shillinge fower pence
 more Item I give unto my wife thre arces of wheate and thre arces of Barley one arce of
 pease, two kint twentie sheepe two hogg pigge, all my household stuffe, except to great brass
 potts, one forname, my best bedd and best coverled, one paire of my best sheet, one payre
 of my best blanket, one chert and one Aubord two ioyne stooles, and half of wood. And I
 give unto my daughter Jane Daubrow five shillinge, and my daughter Dorothy Lync one
 five shillinge more Item I give unto my Sonne Richard his children one and twentie pound
 whereof my grandchild Richard shall have five pound of the foresaid summe I give unto my
 daughter Agnes Lync one bushell of wheate, I make my Sonne George Lync sole Executor
 of this my last will and Testament unto whom I give all the rest of goods and Chattells
 to bequeathed both moveable and unmoveable. I appoint my Sonne Richard his children
 legacies to be paid unto my Sonne Christopher Linton within twelve monthes after my
 decease, my grandchild Richard to have five pound of the one and twentie before
 bequeathed. And the rest of my Sonne Richard his children to have fower pound apiece
 And if any of them happen to die, then their portion to be divided amongst the rest, I
 appoint my Sonne Linton to pay the interest of the said legacies unto their behest, either
 to bind them apprenticed as he shall thinke good, I give unto our Vicar Thomas Good
 five shillinge In witness whereof I have here unto sett my hand the day and yeare first
 above written Richard Lync his mark. Witnessed here unto Thomas Good James
 Elderton Richard Cymwell.
